The November meeting was our AGM. The official business was very brief. It was quorate. The branch's committee has transitioned from an interim to a formal committee. Five members stood unopposed in the recent election held in accordance with the union's rules with officer roles and responsibilities to be determined.

Guest Speaker Report - Chris Stafford, CEO of Curve Theatre - available as an audio podcast on YouTube

Curve Theatre's CEO Chris Stafford was invited to address the branch meeting as a guest speaker. The intended scope was to provide an overview of Curve's approach to casting, community engagement, and relationship with Equity.

In the meeting, Chris emphasised his desire for an informal, conversational format rather than a presentation, to allow for more insightful feedback. While unable to cover all intended topics in depth due to time constraints, he provided a broad outline of Curve's commitment to nurturing local talent, reflecting diversity on stage, and serving the Leicester community through arts initiatives targeting deprived areas.

Chris highlighted Curve's positive relationship with Equity, citing his involvement in recent UK Theatre union negotiations. He discussed efforts to improve creative staff's work-life balance by trialling 5-day rehearsal weeks. The conversation touched on the challenges of declining drama audiences post-Covid, balancing prudent finances with producing new works, and dealing with disruptive audience behaviour.

Branch members Gillian Geddes and Siobhan Cannon-Brownlee asked questions about accessibility for those reliant on public transport and gender diversity in creative leadership roles respectively. Chris acknowledged the transport issues and explained Curve's approach to assembling creative teams based on individual suitability, while aiming for gender balance across productions.

The guest speaker segment provided an open forum for the branch to engage with a leading regional theatre's CEO, gaining insight into Curve's inner workings and strategic outlook. Chris Stafford's presence facilitated a productive discussion at the East Midlands branch's November meeting, held in Curve Theatre's boardroom.

We look forward to continuing to engage and support all members across the region.
